Glen Doherty was one of the four Americans killed in a terror attack in Benghazi, Libya on 9/12/12. On September 11, 2012 insurgents attacked the US Consulate in Benghazi, Libya. Glen fought hard throughout the night and saved many before succumbing to a mortar attack in the early hours of September 12th. Glen died serving with men he respected, protecting the freedoms we enjoy as Americans and doing something he loved. He is an American Hero to those who did not know him; but for those who did he is a best friend who leaves behind a giant hole in our hearts.

WILLIAM EISENHART

*Explosive Ordnance Technician, US Navy, Army National Guard
Special Operations Combat Medic, Army National Guard
Yale University, School of Medicine / Physician Assistant Program*

William was born in South Korea and immigrated to the United States with his mother as an infant. After 9/11, William left his career as an Internet Engineer and enlisted in the Navy at age 30. He served as an Explosive Ordnance Technician, deploying, and disarming Improvised Explosive Devices. He saw the injuries created by these devices while doing Tactical Emergency Casualty Care, but was not able to do more in the chain of survivability. He left the Navy and worked as an intelligence analyst but decided to return to the military and became a Special Operations Combat Medic for a Special Forces Battalion in the Army National Guard.

William understood that his role in the military did not translate to the civilian sector, so he applied and was accepted to the Yale School of Medicine Physician Assistant Online Program. He hopes to work with other Special Operations Medics overseas helping underserved populations.



VALERIE KUTSCH

*US Military Academy, Military Intelligence Officer
MIT Sloan School of Management, MIT
US Army Reserves*

Valerie grew up on a small farm in Bozeman, Montana. She graduated and commissioned from the United States Military Academy in 2015 as a Military Intelligence Officer. She served in the military for 5 years developing and leading teams most recently supporting special operations in 1st Special Forces Group. Valerie learned that good planning is critical to effective disaster response. She worked in Chile and Afghanistan and realized that improvements should be made to coordinate and respond to disaster situations across cultural barriers. She credits her disaster response experience, including close proximity to a suicide bomber, as one of the motivations of her desire to work in crisis management.

Valerie is pursuing an MBA from the MIT Sloan School of Management while also continuing to serve in the Army Reserves. After her studies, Valerie hopes to make an impact by optimizing supply chains in emergency situations.



ANTHONY TAYLOR

In 2010, Anthony decided to join Army ROTC to pay for his education at Wake Forest University. Following the Benghazi Attacks, Anthony was inspired to join the Special Operations community and set a new goal: to become an Army Ranger. In 2014, he commissioned as an Infantry Officer and completed Ranger School at Fort Benning, Georgia. Anthony went on to serve as both a Platoon Leader and Executive Officer in the 82nd Airborne Division's elite Pathfinder Company at Fort Bragg, NC. and later served as a Ranger Platoon Leader in the 75th Ranger Regiment's Special Troops Battalion at Fort Benning, GA. In 2017, Anthony deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Freedom's Sentinel. In 2019, after sustaining a series of injuries, Anthony pivoted out of the military and into school.

He plans to use both degrees to pursue his goal of starting his own consulting company within the increasingly regulated higher education industry. Anthony lives in Chicago with his wife and son where he enjoys home improvement projects and playing with his two dogs.
